**NOVEMBER 8, 2022 ELECTION DAY REMINDERS -** We all should take a moment to recognize the dedication of our village's poll workers and village clerk as they handle the tasks required to properly conduct our local elections with integrity and accuracy. Clerk Jodi Patoka provided a few answers to frequently asked questions:

- The Polls at the Village Hall (160 Mill Street) OPEN at 7:00 am and CLOSE at 8:00 pm
- Only those residents registered to vote in the Village of Amherst can vote in the Amherst Village Hall
- Voters need to bring a valid Wisconsin ID with photo
- If you have changed addresses, you can reregister with the Village Clerk on Election Day
- Residents interested in serving as Election Inspectors can ask Jodi about applying for the post and the training involved.

SPRING ELECTIONS 2023: The Village of Amherst has been a place of growth and progress, with village trustees working with our staff and our residents to address the opportunities and challenges encountered. We look to the talents, experiences and ideas of our neighbors who offer to serve in public office for a two-year term to help guide our community. We need to encourage our neighbors here within the village to consider running for a position on the Village Board. YARD WASTE SITE OPEN TO VILLAGE RESIDENTS - Now that our yards are hidden under piles of autumn leaves, and village residents are reminded that they can find a place to dispose of them at the collection sites next to the sewer plant on Prairie View Street. Tree limbs and sticks collected by village residents also have a spot at the site, but large tree trunks and stumps present problems. Residents with materials of this nature should contact the village staff (715-824-5613) to determine their acceptability. For a nominal fee and depending upon availability, village residents can have staff leave a village truck at your house for you to load your yard materials on for latter pick-up. Contact Jodi at the village hall (715-824-5613) to make arrangements. PLEASE note the BRUSH PILE and the LEAVE PILE, unloading your items in their proper places. ONLY leaves and brush should be left - PLEASE DO NOT leave behind any plastic bags, plant pots and containers, stone or cement materials or other yard ornaments.

**FREDDIES HOME PLATE IN NELSON PARK PROGRESS** – Some design modifications are being worked on to bring this project in at a cost reduction when it is sent out for rebidding. With the field lighting installation underway, the structure's design changes will maintain the improved restrooms, concession stand and covered patio, and the refurbished parking lot will benefit those using the park or the businesses downtown.
